Preface: After Jesus' crucifixion and burial on Friday, Mary Magdalene had gone to Jesus' tomb early on Sunday morning. Finding the stone removed, she ran and told the disciples. Peter and the beloved disciple came and found the tomb empty with only the grave cloths there, yet, without fully understanding, it says that the beloved disciple "**saw** and believed." After they left, Mary remained outside weeping. She **sees** two angels in the tomb who ask her why she's weeping. "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him," she says. Now Jesus performed many other signs in the presence of his disciples which have not been written in this book.
